THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Church Family,

How do we respond to the assassination of Charlie Kirk? The world clearly seems different after the Utah tragedy; everyone seems to agree on this point. The news media offers nonstop coverage, and social media is a battleground.

Amid this unexpected chaos, each of us is trying to interpret the event to re-establish order if possible – into our world and into the world of those around us. As the battle rages, I offer the following suggestions:

- 1. Always speak the truth and speak the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15).
- 2. Love your enemy. Jesus tells us the uniqueness of His followers is that they love even their enemies, as anyone can love their friends (Matthew 5:43).
- 3. Limit social media time. Unfortunately, some folks are now spending all their time in dark rabbit holes that are created to confuse and enrage. Catch up on the news, then re-establish the order of your day. Doing acts of kindness for others is

far more productive than lowering yourself to arguing with fools — fools that you don't even know. Just because you can say it doesn't mean you should say it. We should especially limit children's exposure to the dangerous influence of social media.

4. Realize that chaos always results when creation (humanity) ignores the boundaries of the Creator: boundaries that respect life ("Thou shalt not kill"), boundaries that respect gender ("Male and female, He created them"), human sexual boundaries ("A man shall leave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife"), or emotional boundaries ("He that is slow to wrath is of great understanding").

As God's people, we need to be part of the solution, not part of the problem. May the dark world see our light; may the world of hatred see our love; and may those who act and speak rashly observe our godly restraint.
