Daniel 1-6 Daniel's life and friends, 7-12 Daniel's visions

Daniel 1: Hebrew, Daniel 2-7: Aramaic, Daniel 8-12: Hebrew

Daniel 1-3

Persecution and threat #1: Delivered from food, sin to over value bread...Lust of the Flesh, stoves to bread, delicious fruit

1 (605) Grooming of Daniel and friends from Judah to serve in Nebuchadnezzar's court. Refusal to eat the king's food. Daniel and friends excel above the others.

Kingdoms of the earth #1 (Babylon -> Medo-Persia -> Greece -> Rome -> Ancient of Days)

2 (603) Nebuchadnezzar ask a hard thing and a gives harsh decree. God reveals to Daniel the dream and its meaning. This is a dream of what it will happen in the future. It was a dream of a statue made of different metals that represented kingdoms. In the dream the statue is destroyed. After tell Nebuchadnezzar the dream, Daniel is elevated with his friends.

Persecution and threat #2: delivered from fire, sin to worship another...Lust of the Eye, kingdoms of the earth, beautiful fruit

3 A giant statue is set up and people are required to bow down or to be thrown into a fiery furnace. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refuse to serve and worship Nebuchadnezzar's gods. They are thrown into the furnace but are delivered. Nebuchadnezzar praises God and elevates the three to positions of authority.

Daniel 4-6

The kings pride #1

4 Another dream of Nebuchadnezzar represented his temporary downfall until he came to his senses and worship the Lord God.

The kings pride #2

5 (539) Belshazzar great feast and the handwriting on the wall. Daniel interprets the downfall of Babylon. That very night Babylon fell and Belshazzar was killed.

Persecution and threat #3: delivered from the lions, sin to presume on God...Pride of Life, threw yourself down, fruit could make one wise (choice of mark of beast or perish and if I perish I perish)
 6 (539) Daniel accused out of jealousy for worshipping God. Daniel was throw to the Lion but he was protected. His accusers are thrown to the lions.

Monday: August 30th

Daniel 7-9

Kingdoms of the earth #2 (Babylon -> Medo-Persia -> Greece -> Rome -> Ancient of Days)

7 (556) Daniel dream of four beast. These beast represent the kingdoms following Babylon until the kingdom of the son of man.

(Medo-Persia -> Greece)

8 (554) The dream of the ram and goat. Gabriel explains this dream.

How long? 70 X 7, 70 sets of sevens, 483 years + 7 years = 490 years

9 (539) Daniel prays for Jerusalem and realizes the end of the 70 years of Judgment. Daniel confesses for the people. The 70 weeks of Daniel.

Tuesday: August 31st

Daniel 10-12 (**3rd Vision**)

10 (536) Daniel receive a message from a man dresses in linen that comes to encourage him and give him a message

11 The kingdom and kings that will come in the future. With Israel in the middle the war will occur on both sides. The temple will be desecrated in the process.

12 at the end there will be a great time of anxious but the time period is defined by God and in the end the wicked will perish but the God will be blessed.

Five things to know from the vision portion of Daniel (7-12):

- 1. there are four kingdoms beginning with Babylon and ending with the fifth kingdom, the Kingdom of God**
- 2. there are 490 years for this to transpire 69 sevens + 1 sevens. The first set of 69 weeks begins with the decree to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem and ends with the death of Jesus. The period of the church represented by the presence of the Holy Spirit divides the 69th and 70th weeks. The last set of sevens (70th week) will be the tribulation period.**
- 3. the "sacrilegious object that causes desolation" will be revealed ½ through the last set of sevens (Daniel's seventh week)**
- 4. the tribulation will end with the return of Christ to the earth (the 2nd advent) and the 1000 year reign of Christ will follow.**
- 5. the book of Daniel and all the Bible demonstrates a pattern of pride yet a promise of comfort**

Lesson from Daniel: Pattern -> Pride Promise -> Comfort

Eden (Genesis 2) → Isaiah 11:6-16 → Acts 2:23 → New Heaven and New Earth (Revelation 21:4)**

Wednesday: September 1st

Hosea 1-3

- 1 Hosea’s command to marry Gomer and have children with names to demonstrate God message to His people.
- 2 Illustration of Israel as an unfaithful wife.
- 3 Hosea command to go remarry Gomer to illustrate how once again God will bring Israel back.
(3:4 is an illustration of a near-far prophecy...is the return from exile, when Jesus 1st advent, or when Israel is regathered in the book of Revelation, prior to Jesus 2nd advent...see Acts 3:20; Revelation 7:1-8, 19:11-16)

Thursday: September 2nd

Hosea 4-6

- 4 The reason for trouble in the land. The priest have not led the people well and the people have not done well.
- 5 God will betray the people in judgment and discipline.
- 6 God desires to restore Israel but they would not respond.

Questions

SCRIPTURE BEFORE PHONE

The Habit at a Glance:

Refusing to check the phone until after reading a passage of Scripture is a way of replacing the question "What do I need to do today?" with a better one, "Who am I and who am I becoming?" We have no stable identity outside of Jesus. Daily immersion in the Scriptures resists the anxiety of emails, the anger of news, and the envy of social media. Instead it forms us daily in our true identity as children of the King, dearly loved.

An Excerpt From [The Common Rule](#):

I often turn to work and career in the search for my identity. I hope that by achieving success I will finally become someone who is approved of. The habit of checking work emails first thing every morning encouraged this misguided search for identity because it started my day with the questions: What do I need to do to make someone else happy with me? How can I justify my existence in the world today?

How did Isaiah die? **The tradition is that he was placed in a hollowed out log then it was "sawed in half" possible under the order of King Manasseh (see Hebrews 11:37)**

What is Jeremiah's "aka"? **the weeping prophet**

What major event occurred during Jeremiah's ministry? When? **Seige, fall of Jerusalem and exile to Bablylon (605-586)**

What are four important topics in the book of Jeremiah? **Book of comfort (30-33), New covenant (31), fall of Jerusalem (40-45,52)**

Who recorded Jeremiah's prophecies? **Baruch**

What king was read Jeremiah's prophecies and what did he do with them? **Jehoahaz and cut them apart strip by strip and through them into the fire.**

What did Jeremiah tell the people they should do? **Surrender to the Babylonians**

What did the false prophets tell them? **Everything would be ok**

What did the people do to try to silence Jeremiah? **The placed him in a cistern with mud to his knees,**

What governor did the Babylonians place over Judah? What happened to him? **Gedaliah, he was assassinated**

Where did some of the people remaining in Jerusalem go and took Jeremiah? **Egypt**

How long did Jeremiah prophecy the exile would last? **70 years**

How does the book of Jeremiah end? **King Jehoichin's release from prison and care by the Evil-merodach, the king of Babylon (561 BC)**

Lamentations' Test answers

Who wrote Lamentations? **It is anonymous but assumed that it was written by Jeremiah**

How many chapter are in Lamentations and how is it divided? **Five chapters and five separate laments**

How are all but the last chapter arranged? **Each verse or a group of verses are an acrostics or they begin with the letters of the Hebrew alphabet**

Ezekiel's Test answers

What was the time frame of Ezekiel's ministry? **592 – 570 BC**

Where was he when prophesied? What was his profession and how old was he? **Babylon, priest, 30 years old**

What New Testament book has many similarities to Ezekiel? **Revelations**

Where is the reference to the fall of Satan? **Where else is it found in the Bible? Ezekiel 28 (Isaiah 14)**

Major topics of the book of Ezekiel? **Vision of the glory of God, Condemnation of Judah and the surrounding nations, Measuring of the temple, valley of dry bones, Gog and Magog**

3 God is obligated because of His relationship with Israel to punish her for her sin


4 the people live in luxury but they will be carried off by foreign people, God tried again and again to get their attention but they would not listen or respond

69 x 7 x 360 = 173,880 days

March 5, 444 B.C. + 173,880 = March 30, A.D. 33

 476 years x 365.2421989 days = 173,855 days
 + days between March 5 and March 30 = 25 days
 Totals = 173,880 days


Rationale for 360-Day Years

1/2 week—Dan. 9:27
 Time, times, 1/2 time—Dan. 7:25, 12:7; Rev. 12:14
 1,260 days—Rev. 12:6, 11:3
 42 months—Rev. 11:2, 13:5
 Thus: 42 months = 1,260 days = time, times, 1/2 time + 1/2 week
 Therefore: month = 30 days; year = 360 days


Seventy Week Timeline

(Daniel 9:24-27)




Seventy Weeks of Daniel




Premillennialism Timeline

The Major and Minor Prophets and Their Audiences






