**Isaiah wraps up with eternal place in heaven for the righteous and Jeremiah confronts the people with their sin as the reason for their problems and the solution was to repent and do right**

Isaiah 58-62

58 couple fasting and Sabbath day ritual with pure actions

59 God is strong and He will save them if they repent because of His covenant with them

60 Israel will be the light to the nations as the people return and they are honored by the nations

61 the day of the Lord will turn sorrow into joy

62 prepare the way of the Lord for the people who are His delight

Saturday: July 31<sup>st</sup>

Isaiah 63-66

63 Edom's judgment and Israel question if God is still their Father

64 a call for God to come, forgive their sins and rebuild His temple

65 the righteous will live in a glorious kingdom

66 a great end for the righteous but eternal destruction for the wicked

Sunday: August 1<sup>st</sup>

Jeremiah 1-6

1 Jeremiah's call to speak for God and God promises to protect him

2 trouble for Israel because of their idolatry and they will go into exile

3 Judah did not learn the lessons of Israel, but there is a hope of great times to come but not now

4 judgment is coming

5 foreign gods will result in foreign oppression

6 great judgment is coming

Monday: August 2<sup>nd</sup>

Jeremiah 7-10

7 terrible sin will result in terrible judgment

8 there is no healing for these people

9 weeping for Israel because their uncircumcised heart

10 God is not a mere idol

Tuesday: August 3<sup>rd</sup>

Jeremiah 11-15

11 the curses for breaking the covenant will come upon them and plot to kill Jeremiah

12 even foreign nations that obey the Lord will find a place among His people

13 the illustration of a loincloth, reason for destruction

14 plea to the Lord for help, God will not listen, lying prophets, prayer of confession

15 destruction because of past sin, Jeremiah complains of his suffering

Wednesday: August 4<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 16-20

16 destruction coming but promise of future deliverance

17 idolatry of the people, blessing to those who obey but curses on disobedience

18 illustration of the potter, puzzling behavior, trap against Jeremiah

19 illustration of the clay jar, the terrible behavior, smashed jar, disaster coming

20 Jeremiah arrested and whipped, Jeremiah's lament

Thursday: August 5<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 21-25

21 Zedekiah's prayer but God will not listen

22 character of repentance, reason for ruin of the city, Jehoahaz and Jehoiakim's sin

23 evil shepherds but God will take care of his flock, "in that day" God will rescue, evil and lying prophets

24 after Jehoiachin exile, illustration of good and rotten figs

25 605 BC, consistent warning, people would not listen, Babylon appointed to destroy Israel for 40 years, God’s cup of anger, terrible judgment to come

### Summary of this week's reading ...

**Jeremiah continues to preach to a rebellious nation until finally God uses Babylon to capture it and send it into captivity. Jeremiah faithfully proclaims God's truth even in the midst of persecution. God, through Jeremiah, also prophecies the destruction of Babylon and the return of a remnant of the people.**

### Daily and Chapter Summaries

Friday: August 6<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 26-29

26 Jeremiah mobbed and threaten for speaking out against Jerusalem but some defended him

27 Jeremiah wears a yoke to tell the people they should submit to the King of Babylon and live under his control and to not listen to the false prophets that say Babylon will not conquer and rule over them

28 (593 BC) Jeremiah contradicts Hananiah's false prophecy and predicts his death

29 Jeremiah writes a letter to exiles in Babylon predicting a 70 year captivity but promises return and Jeremiah responds to Shemaiah a false prophet in Babylon

**ch. 29 a critical passage**

Saturday: August 7<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 30-33

30 Jeremiah predicts trouble for Israel in the future but in the end they will be saved

31 Jeremiah predicts a gathering of the people of Israel from their scattering and God will make a NEW COVENANT with them

**ch 31 a critical passage**

32 (587 BC) Jeremiah buys a piece of property demonstrating that Israel will return and buy and sell land

33 Jeremiah predicts that Israel will return and a son of David will sit on the throne

**ch. 33 a critical passage**

Monday: August 9<sup>th</sup>

### Jeremiah 34-36

34 Jeremiah's message to King Zedekiah and rebuke to the people for enslaving its own people

35 Jeremiah tells the people of the Recabite family

36 (605 BC) Jeremiah gives Baruch the messages to read to the people and then to the people, King Jehoiakim burned it and Jeremiah rewrote the message

ch. 36 interesting chapter to read

Tuesday: August 10<sup>th</sup>

### Jeremiah 37-39

37 Jeremiah prophesied that even with a handful of soldiers Babylonian would defeat them, Jeremiah was arrested and flogged but Zedekiah placed him in house arrest in the palace

38 Jeremiah was placed in a cistern but Zedekiah released him, Jeremiah tells Zedekiah to surrender

39 (588 to 586) Jerusalem falls to Babylon, Zedekiah captured and taken to Babylon, Jeremiah remains in Jerusalem

ch. 39 an interesting chapter to read

Wednesday: August 11<sup>th</sup>

### Jeremiah 40-45

40 Gedaliah, governor of Israel, appointed by Nebuchadnezzar is kind to Jeremiah

41 Gedaliah is killed and most of his officials and Johanan saved the people

42 Jeremiah warns them about escaping to Egypt

43 they do not listen to Jeremiah but went to Egypt anyway and took Jeremiah also and he warns that Nebuchadnezzar will come there

44 idolatry was the reason for their trouble and the people that came to Egypt will die there but people did not listen, the queen of heaven will not help them, only a remnant will return

45 positive words to Baruch

Thursday: August 12<sup>th</sup>

### Jeremiah 46-52

46 warning against Egypt because Babylon is coming to destroy it, Jacob will be saved

47 Philistia will be destroyed

48 Moab is being destroyed

49 Ammon, Edom, Damascus, Kedar and Hazor, and Elam will have great sorrow


50 Babylon will fall, Israel will return home while Babylon will be devastated

51 God used Babylon to punish the nations but now Babylon has fallen, God has punished her



52 history of the fall of Jerusalem


Verses	Date	Events
28 1-3	597	3,023 captives when to Babylon (when Jehoiachin was taken to Babylon after reigning for only 3 months) Zedekiah became king for 11 years
3-5	588	Zedekiah rebelled against the King of Babylon
6-29	586	Zedekiah's capture and the destruction of Jerusalem, 586 captives went to Babylon
30	581	745 captives went to Babylon, total 4,600
31-34	561	Jehoiachin, the previous king of Israel prior to Zedekiah who had been taken to Babylon (2 Chronicles 36:10) was released from prison and treated kindly by Evil-merodach, the Babylonian king

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

Jeremiah prophesied from the 13th year of Josiah (627 BC) past the fall of Judah (586 BC) to about 580 BC.

His ministry spanned 4 decades and the reigns of 5 kings of Judah.
