## Looking Back

Reading: Jeremiah 26-52

Speed...

### Summary of this week's reading ...

**Jeremiah continues to preach to a rebellious nation until finally God uses Babylon to capture it and send it into captivity. Jeremiah faithfully proclaims God's truth even in the midst of persecution. God, through Jeremiah, also prophecies the destruction of Babylon and the return of a remnant of the people.**

Friday: August 6<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 26-29

26 Jeremiah mobbed and threaten for speaking out against Jerusalem but some defended him

27 Jeremiah wears a yoke to tell the people they should submit to the King of Babylon and live under his control and to not listen to the false prophets that say Babylon will not conquer and rule over them

28 (593 BC) Jeremiah contradicts Hananiah's false prophecy and predicts his death

29 Jeremiah writes a letter to exiles in Babylon predicting a 70 year captivity but promises return and Jeremiah responds to Shemaiah a false prophet in Babylon

32 (587 BC) Jeremiah buys a piece of property demonstrating that Israel will return and buy and sell land

33 Jeremiah predicts that Israel will return and a son of David will sit on the throne

**ch. 33 a critical passage**

Monday: August 9<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 34-36

34 Jeremiah's message to King Zedekiah and rebuke to the people for enslaving its own people

35 Jeremiah tells the people of the Recabite family

36 (605 BC) Jeremiah gives Baruch the messages to read to the people and then to the people, King Jehoiakim burned it and Jeremiah rewrote the message

ch. 36 interesting chapter to read

Tuesday: August 10<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 37-39

37 Jeremiah prophesied that even with a handful of soldiers Babylonian would defeat them, Jeremiah was arrested and flogged but Zedekiah placed him in house arrest in the palace

38 Jeremiah was placed in a cistern but Zedekiah released him, Jeremiah tells Zedekiah to surrender

39 (588 to 586) Jerusalem falls to Babylon, Zedekiah captured and taken to Babylon, Jeremiah remains in Jerusalem

ch. 39 an interesting chapter to read

Wednesday: August 11<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 40-45

40 Gedaliah, governor of Israel, appointed by Nebuchadnezzar is kind to Jeremiah

41 Gedaliah is killed and most of his officials and Johanan saved the people

42 Jeremiah warns them about escaping to Egypt

43 they do not listen to Jeremiah but went to Egypt anyway and took Jeremiah also and he warns that Nebuchadnezzar will come there

44 idolatry was the reason for their trouble and the people that came to Egypt will die there but people did not listen, the queen of heaven will not help them, only a remnant will return

45 positive words to Baruch

Thursday: August 12<sup>th</sup>

Jeremiah 46-52

46 warning against Egypt because Babylon is coming to destroy it, Jacob will be saved

47 Philistia will be destroyed

48 Moab is being destroyed

49 Ammon, Edom, Damascus, Kedar and Hazor, and Elam will have great sorrow

50 Babylon will fall, Israel will return home while Babylon will be devastated

51 God used Babylon to punish the nations but now Babylon has fallen, God has punished her

- 3 Ezekiel was told to eat the scroll, Ezekiel is taken the Judean exiles, and told to be a watchman and messenger to the people
- 4 demonstration of the siege of Jerusalem, ration of food and water
- 5 shaving hair and demonstrate the judgment of Judea with what he does with the hair
- 6 message to the mountains of Israel for their idolatry and a few will recognize their rebellion and repent

Ezekiel 7-11

7 the Day of Judgment has come because of idolatry and injustice then they will know that God is the Lord

8 (592) Ezekiel is shown the great sins of Israel in Jerusalem

9 a man dressed in linen, killing of the people of the city without the mark on their foreheads

10 man dressed in linen, the four living creatures and the four wheels

11 wicked counsel that says that Jerusalem is safe as meat in an iron pot, but they are not safe but they will be scattered but there is hope for some whose heart will be changed

Tuesday: August 17<sup>th</sup>

Ezekiel 12-15

12 demonstration of packing for a journey, a message to Zedekiah, God will spare a few, but God's judgment will not be delayed

13 false prophets will be judged for predicting peace that will not come, judgment against false women prophets

14 idols in the heart, judgment will not be diverted even if Daniel, Noah, and Job were there

15 the people of Jerusalem are as useless as grapevine

Wednesday: August 18<sup>th</sup>

Ezekiel 16-19

16 Israel called as a discarded infant who grows up but becomes unfaithful like a prostitute but someday she will be restored

*a key passage on the origin, grace, sin, and restoration of Israel*

17 riddle of two eagles and its explanation

18 everyman will be judged according to their own actions, sinful actions can be forgiven if repented

19 a funeral song or lament of a lion and a vine

Thursday: August 19<sup>th</sup>

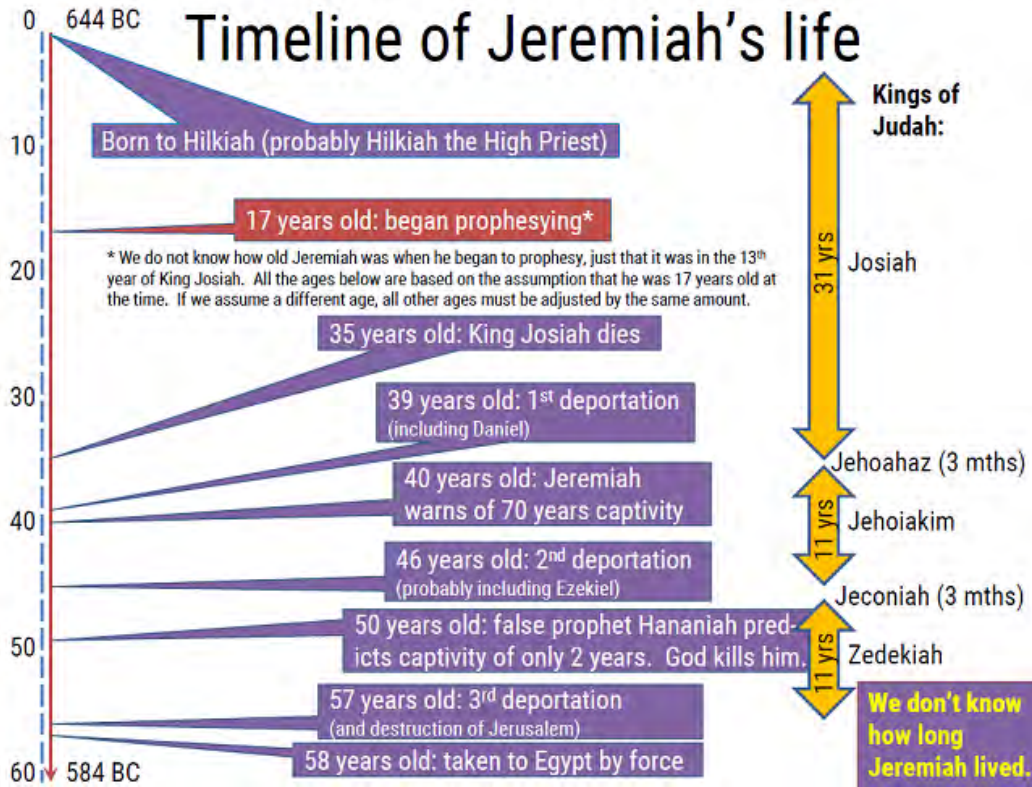
Ezekiel 20-23

20 (591) God rehearses the history and rebellion of the Israelites while God rebukes them

21 a terrible swift sword, Babylon attacks on Jerusalem and Ammonites destruction

22 judgment of Jerusalem and its leaders, dross and worthless slag, no one can stand in the gap

23 two sisters that are prostitutes, Samaria and Jerusalem, they will both be judged

Born 644 BC and died 584 BC (lived 60 years)

Live during reign of Josiah, Jehoahaz, Jehoiakim, Jehoiachin, Zedekiah, and the Babylonian Governor Gedaliah

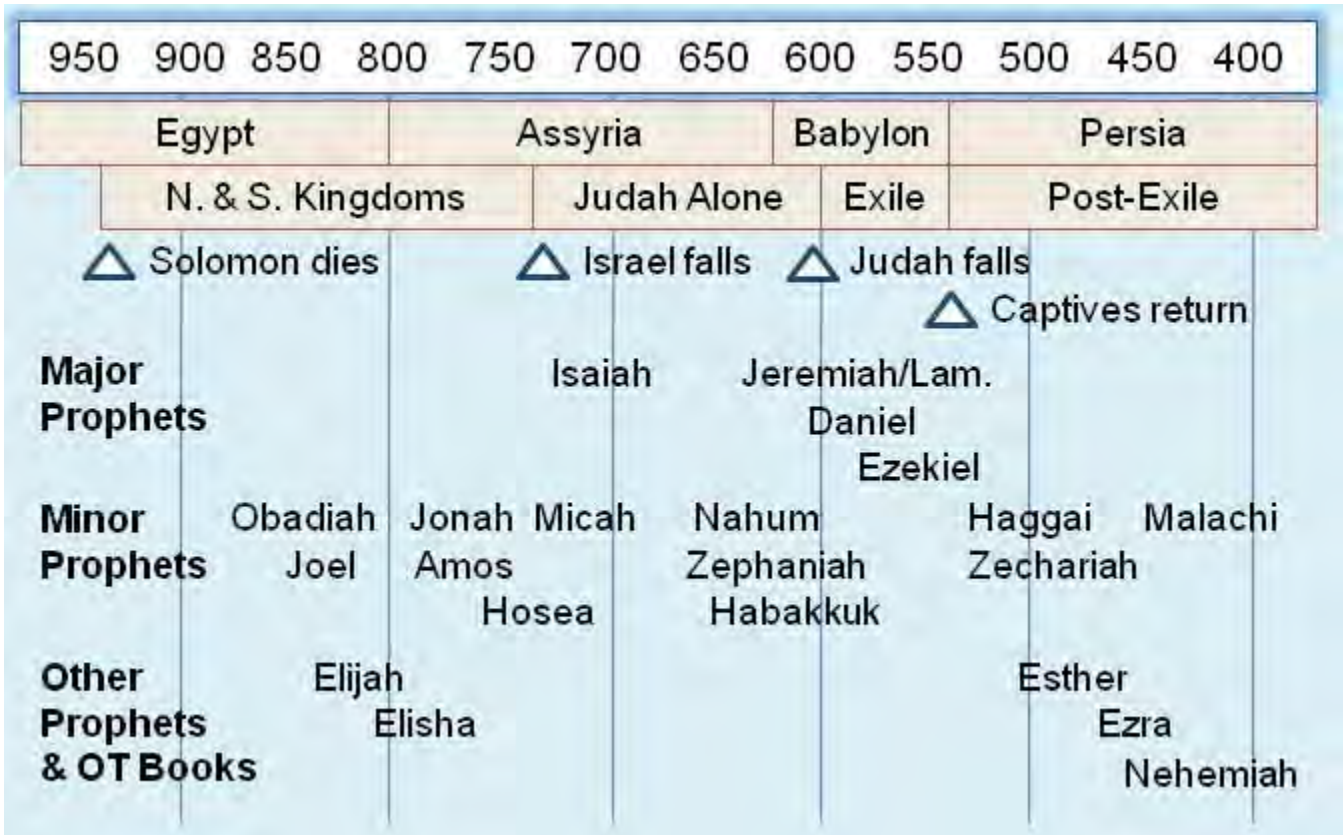

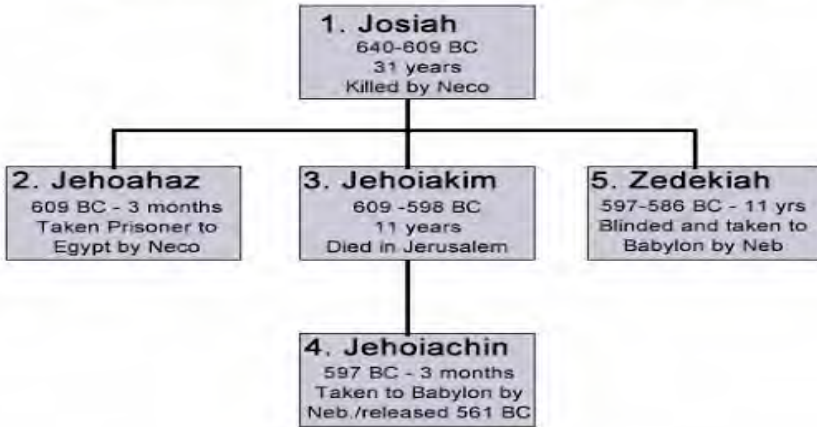
Events of Jeremiah 52

Verses	Date	Events
28 1-3	597	3,023 captives when to Babylon (when Jehoiachin was taken to Babylon after reigning for only 3 months) Zedekiah became king for 11 years
3-5	588	Zedekiah rebelled against the King of Babylon
6-29	586	Zedekiah’s capture and the destruction of Jerusalem, 586 captives went to Babylon
30	581	745 captives went to Babylon, total 4,600
31-34	561	Jehoiachin, the previous king of Israel prior to Zedekiah who had been taken to Babylon (2 Chronicles 36:10) was released from prison and treated kindly by Evil-merodach, the Babylonian king

# Chronology of Jeremiah

## PERIODS OF PROPHETIC MINISTRY



Jeremiah prophesied from the 13th year of Josiah (627 BC) past the fall of Judah (586 BC) to about 580 BC.

His ministry spanned 4 decades and the reigns of 5 kings of Judah.
