Jesus ministry was characterized by preaching/teaching, healing the sick, and casting out demons. **See Luke 4:14-41**

14 plot to kill Jesus, Jesus is anointed, Judas is paid to betray, arrangements for Passover meal, Jesus says he will be betrayed by one of the twelve, the cup and bread, they head to Mount of Olives, Peter promises not to deny Him, Jesus prays, Jesus is betrayed to a mob, sliced ear, rebuked for not arresting in the daytime, a young man flees, Jesus before the council, Jesus admits that He is the Messiah, they strike Jesus, Peter denies Jesus

2 Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem, birth, angelic announcement, shepherds visit Mary and Joseph, circumcision, dedication, object of prophesy of Simeon and Anna, Passover visit and Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem after **three days**

Sunday: October 17th

Luke 3-6

3 time that ministry of John the Baptist began ministry, example of John's preaching, John baptizes Jesus, Jesus' genealogy all the way back to Adam (**Jesus is the Messiah for all humanity**)

4 temptation of Jesus by Satan (**bread, possession and authority, presumption of the person of God**), (**Jesus in Galilee**) Jesus visits boyhood home, Nazareth, and reveals himself as the Messiah (**Isaiah 61:1-2**) and the people rejected him (**identifies himself the Messiah of the whole world, Jews and Gentiles**), cast out demon, heals Peter's mother-in-law, heals many people

5 a great catch and calling of four disciples, heals leper, heals a paralyzed man, conflict with religious leaders over who could forgive sin, calling of Matthew, question of fasting, patching of new garment

6 conflict over harvesting grain on Sabbath, healing a man with a deformed hand, choose twelve disciples, heals many, Jesus' teaching, woes (compare blessing with woes), love enemies, do not judge, specks vs. logs, producing good fruit, a strong foundation

Monday: October 18th

Luke 7-9

7 the faith of Roman officer, raising of widows son, John's question about Messiahship, Jesus testimony of Messiahship, John's ministry compared to Jesus, Jesus anointed, the love of the forgiven

8 a preaching tour, parable of sowing seed, lamp and a bowl, the true mother and brothers of God, calming of the storm, Jesus heals man with a legion of demons, healing of Jairus' daughter and a woman with a long term illness

9 sent out disciples, feeding of 5,000, disciples identify Jesus as the Messiah but He will die, unselfish discipleship, transfiguration, predicts death, greatness in kingdom, opposition to those not in group or Samaritans, **(Jesus begins trip to Jerusalem, 9:51)** cost of discipleship

Tuesday: October 19th

Luke 10-12

10 Jesus sends out 70 other disciples with instruction of what to do and what to expect, the 72 report of success, Jesus prayer to the Father, the greatest commandment and a good Samaritan neighbor, Mary's compliment and Martha's rebuke

11 Jesus teaches how to pray, teaching about asking in faith in prayer, Jesus cast out demons and the power of casting out demons, the sign of Jonah, Jesus is greater than Jonah and Solomon, the light of the body, woe to the religion leaders

12 be aware of the religious leaders, do not fear trials, do not put high value in possessions, do not worry about possessions, be ready and waiting for the Lord's return, accountability at the Lord's return, following Jesus will bring divisions, signs of His coming

Wednesday: October 20th

13 the importance of repentance and turning to God, unfruitful fig tree, religious leaders rebuke Jesus for healing on the Sabbath, parable of the mustard seed, parable of yeast, and the illustration of the narrow door and those in the kingdom of God, Jesus heads toward Jerusalem

14 healing the man with pleurisy on the Sabbath, proper seating at a banquet and who to invite, excuses not to come to the feast and those who are invited, the cost of discipleship like a building or a battle, flavorless salt

15 parable of a lost sheep, a lost coin and a lost son

Luke 16-18

16 parable of dishonest manager, the permanence of the Law, a rich man and Lazarus

17 the danger of affecting another by your own sin, doing the right thing, healing ten lepers and one grateful foreigner, the coming of the kingdom and the end

18 persistent prayer, parable of a Pharisee and a tax collector, Jesus acknowledges and blesses the children, the rich man who could not keep all the commandments, giving up for the sake of the kingdom, Jesus predict death, Jesus heals a blind beggar

Saturday: October 23rd

Luke 19-21

19 Zacchaeus repents and entertains Jesus, ten servants that report their stewardship, Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, (**arrival in Jerusalem His destiny**) Jesus weeps over Jerusalem and predicts its downfall, clears out temple

20 religious leaders question Jesus authority, parable of wicked tenant farmers, trick about paying taxes, questioned about life in the resurrection, how is the messiah David's son and Lord, warning about religious leaders

21 the greater gift of the poor widow, Jesus teaches about the signs of the coming of the end yet the security of the believers, the story of the fig tree and warning to listen

Sunday: October 24th

Luke 22-24

22 Judas plans to betray Jesus, preparation of the Passover meal, the Last Supper, the wine and the bread, warning of the betrayer, the greatest in the kingdom, Peter is warned about denying Jesus, Jesus went to Mt. of Olives to pray, Jesus is betrayed by Judas, Peter denies knowing Jesus three times, Jesus admits to be the Son of God in front of the Jewish council

23 Jesus before Pilate, Jesus claims to be the King of the Jews, Jesus before Herod, Pilate forced to crucify Jesus by the crowd and release Barabbas, Jesus led to be crucified with two other criminal, Jesus is mocked, one criminal asked to be remembered by Jesus, darkness over land, the veil of the temple is torn and Jesus dies, Joseph ask for Jesus' body and placed in a tomb

24 early the woman go to tomb but Jesus' body was dead, angels announce that Jesus was alive, the woman told the others, Peter runs to the tomb, the two on the road to Emmaus, the two returned to Jerusalem, Jesus appears, Jesus ate, Jesus explains the scripture, they are told to wait in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit (**see Acts**) Jesus ascended to heaven at Bethany

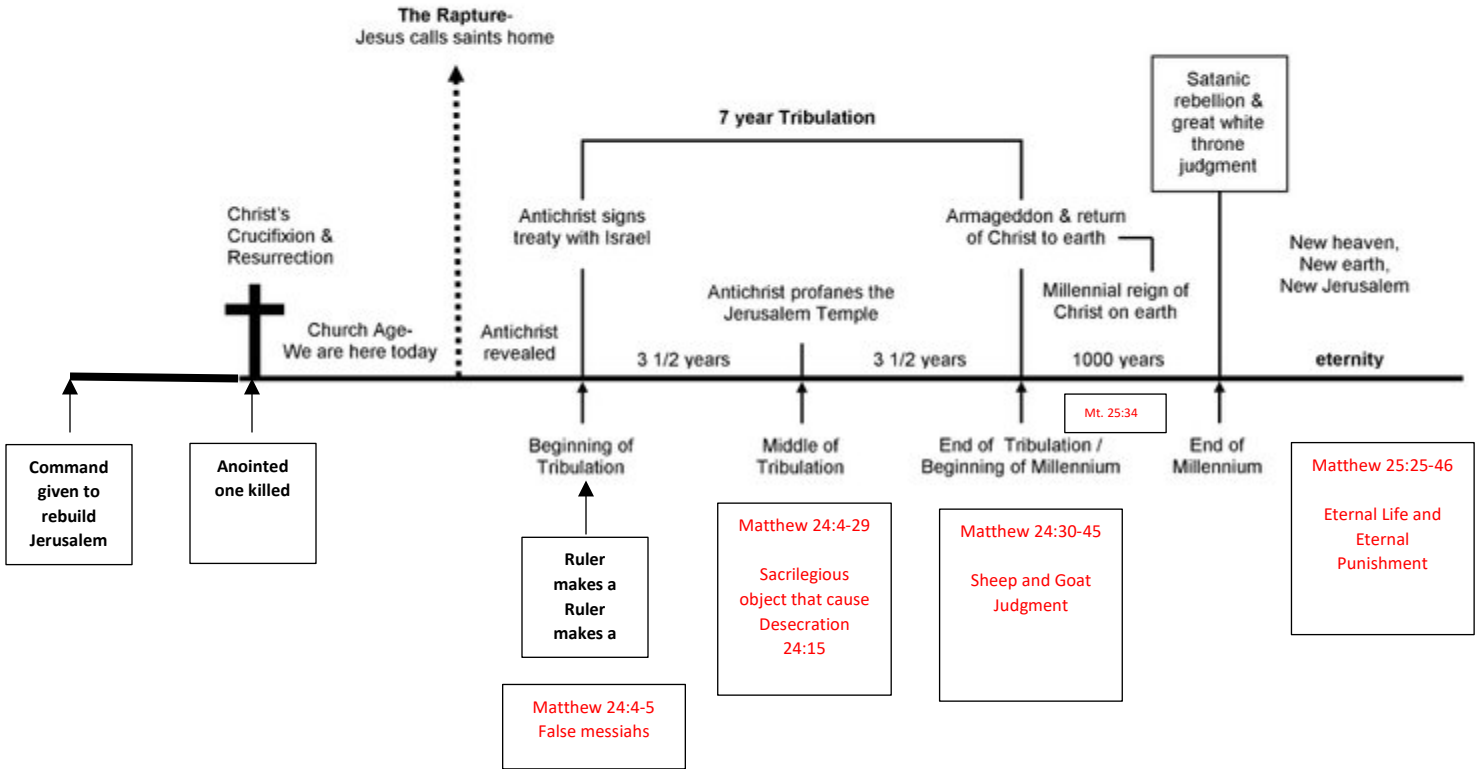

Questions

Is God finished with Israel? Up to now in our reading has he given up on them? We will make our decision on “is he finished with Israel” based on reading of the Word of God. These are important passages and concepts... what is the nature of God, what is the nature of man, why did God enter into Covenant or this holy contract with Israel in the first place, what is that Covenant or contract?

Additional thoughts...

“...you can have all the right notions in your head without ever tasting in your heart the realities to which they refer; and **a simple Bible reader and sermon hearer who is full of the Holy Spirit** will develop a far deeper acquaintance with his God and Savior than a more learned scholar who is content with being theologically correct. The reason is that the former will deal with God regarding the practical application of truth to his life, whereas the latter will not.”

SCRIPTURE BEFORE PHONE

The Habit at a Glance:

Refusing to check the phone until after reading a passage of Scripture is a way of replacing the question "What do I need to do today?" with a better one, "Who am I and who am I becoming?" We have no stable identity outside of Jesus. Daily immersion in the Scriptures resists the **anxiety of emails, the anger of news, and the envy of social media**. Instead it forms us daily in our true identity as children of the King, dearly loved.

WE BECOME WHAT OR WHO WE REFLECT, WHICH IS TO SAY WE BECOME WHAT WE PAY ATTENTION TO

An Excerpt From The Common Rule:

I often turn to work and career in the search for my identity. I hope that by achieving success I will finally become someone who is approved of. This means—as an identity reflector—I have to look at other people’s faces, and my identity is tacked to whether they look happy with me and my work or not.

The habit of checking work emails first thing every morning encouraged this misguided search for identity because it started my day with the questions: What do I need to do to make someone else happy with me? How can I justify my existence in the world today?

Why the many Old Testament reverence in this book? **To show that Jesus is indeed the predicted Messiah**

Why does Matthew have five sections? **To duplicate the five books of Moses (Pentateuch)**

What is found in chapters 5-7, chapters 24-25 and 28:19-20? **The Sermon on the Mount and Jesus’ teaching on the last days, great commission**

What is unique about the genealogy found in Matthew? **Begins with Abraham, Joseph family and includes five women**

23 Jesus before Pilate, Jesus claims to be the King of the Jews, Jesus before Herod, Pilate forced to crucify Jesus by the crowd and release Barabbas, Jesus led to be crucified with two other criminal, Jesus is mocked, one criminal asked to be remembered by Jesus, darkness over land, the veil of the temple is torn and Jesus dies, Joseph ask for Jesus' body and placed in a tomb

24 early the woman go to tomb but Jesus' body was dead, angels announce that Jesus was alive, the woman told the others, Peter runs to the tomb, the two on the road to Emmaus, the two returned to Jerusalem, Jesus appears, Jesus ate, Jesus explains the scripture, they are told to wait in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit (see Acts) Jesus ascended to heaven at Bethany
