Looking Back 7:20-7:40

Summary of this week's reading...Saul having been rejected as king of Israel, David's life follows a very familiar pattern of initial success and popularity then to find himself fleeing for his life. After finding godly character "from the things that he suffered", David is established as king of first a portion of Israel than all of Israel.

Daily and Chapter Summaries

Friday: March 19th

1 Samuel 16-19

The anointing and success of David and the jealousy of Saul

(16) the rejection of Saul as king, a son of Jesse is anointed, Saul receives a tormenting spirit, and David serves in the court of Saul

(17) the Israelites are taunted by a giant Philistine Goliath, David fights and defeat him, and Israel defeats the Philistines

(18) Saul elevates David but with a jealous eye but tries to kill David with a spear twice, David continues to succeed and Saul tries to have David killed through a marriage contract with his daughter Michal

(19) Jonathan the son of Saul sides with David, Saul tries to kill David a third time, Michal warns David and helps him escape

Saturday: March 20th

1 Samuel 20-23

David is a Fugitive from Saul

(20) Jonathan warns David of Saul's intentions and confirms their friendship, Saul curses and tries to kill Jonathan, David flees from the house of Saul

(21) David gets sacred bread from the temple as well as the sword of Goliath from Ahimelech the priest and David resides in Gath

(22) David continues to flee, but Doeg betrays Ahimelech and Saul orders his death and the death of his family

(23) David protects Keilah, David moves to the wilderness and Saul pursues him

Sunday: March 21st

Monday: March 22nd

1 Samuel 24-26

David continues to flee from Saul but honors him as his king.

(24) David protects the Lord's anointed in the cave

(25) Samuel dies, the dealings of David with Nabal and Abigail and his marriage to Abigail

(26) David spares Saul in his own camp and Saul blesses David

Tuesday: March 23rd

1 Samuel 27-31

David lives in the wilderness and the Death of Saul

- (27) David moves to Philistia (Gath then Ziglah)
- (28) Saul and the medium and consultation with the dead Samuel
- (29) David offering to help is rejected by the Philistines
- (30) the camp of David is attacked and plundered, David recovers his people and possessions
- (31) the Philistines defeat Israel and Saul dies

Wednesday March 24th

2 Samuel 1-4

David's Rule becomes Firmly Established

- (1) David learns of the death of Saul and composes a death song for Saul and Jonathan
- (2) David moves to Hebron, the tribe of Judah crowns him king, he reigns there for 7 ½ years, conflict between Abner and Joab, Abner kills Joab's brother
- (3) conflict between the house of Saul and David, Joab kills Abner and David mourns for him
- (4) the son of Saul, Ishbosheth, is killed

Thursday: March 25th

2 Samuel 5-7

David Establishes His Reign in Jerusalem

- (5) David makes Jerusalem his home and defeats the Philistines
- (6) David moves the Ark from Baalah of Judah to Jerusalem, Uzzah dies steadng the Ark, it stays in the house of Obed-edom, and then finally to Jerusalem with great fanfare but Michal discuss
- (7) David's desire to build God a temple and God establishes His Covenant with David, David praises God

Having been established as King of all Israel, David is successful but sins sets in motion a terrible set of consequences that brings death, divides a family, causes the unbelieving people to mock God, and threatens to derail the nation. David manages to hold on and passes the reign onto Solomon. Solomon has the potential of being a wonderful ruler but...

2 Samuel 8-10

David's Military Success

- (8) David is victorious in war, became famous and he was good to his people.
- (9) David is gracious to Mephibosheth for Jonathan's sake.
- (10) David's men are humbled by Ammonites and Israel's response.

Saturday: March 27th

2 Samuel 11-14

David's sin with Bathsheba and its Consequences

- (11) David commits adultery with Bathsheba and arranges for Uriah's death.
- (12) Nathan rebukes David and explains the consequences. David confesses his sin. The new born baby dies. Another child, Solomon, is born. Israel defeat the Amorites in their capitol.
- (13) Amnon rapes Tamar and is killed by Absalom. Absalom is banished.
- (14) Under the direction of Joab, the widow of Tekoa convinces David to allow Absalom to return.

Sunday: March 28th

Monday: March 29th

2 Samuel 15-18

Absalom's Rebellion, Coup, and Death

(15) Absalom steals the hearts of the people then rebels against David. David is forced to flee from Jerusalem.

(16) Zibi brings gifts and a false report of Mephibosheth. Shimei curses David. Ahithophel advises Absalom.

(17) Ahithophel vs. Hushai's advice. Hushai warns David through Zadok and Abiathar. Rejected Ahithophel commits suicide.

(18) David organizes army and goes to battle against Absalom's army. Absalom is killed. David mourns for Absalom.

Tuesday: March 30th

2 Samuel 19-20

A Coup by Sheba is Quenched

(19) Joab rebukes David and David is reinstated as King. Shimei, Mephiboshet, and Barzillai welcome the king. David rebukes the tribe of Judah

(20) Sheba rebels, Joab kills Amasa, and Joab pursues Sheba

Wednesday March 31st

2 Samuel 21-14

David's final actions and words

(21) Famine in the land because Saul broke the vow to the Gibeonites and Philistine battles

(22) David's song (note "rock" vv. 3, 32, 47; 23:3) + other figures of speech

(23) David's last words, three mighty warriors and thirty mighty men (actually 37)

(24) census in the land, David's confession, the consequences of sin, David builds an altar

Thursday: April 1st

1 Kings 1-4

Transition of Kingship to Solomon

(1) David is old and Abishag attends to him, Adonijah's rebellion, Solomon declared king, Adonijah extended grace if loyal

(2) David's charge to Solomon, David dies, Adonijah's request and death Solomon settles with David's enemies

(3) Solomon marries the daughter of Pharaoh, offers sacrifice at Gibeon, ask for wisdom in a dream and demonstrates wisdom with two prostitutes

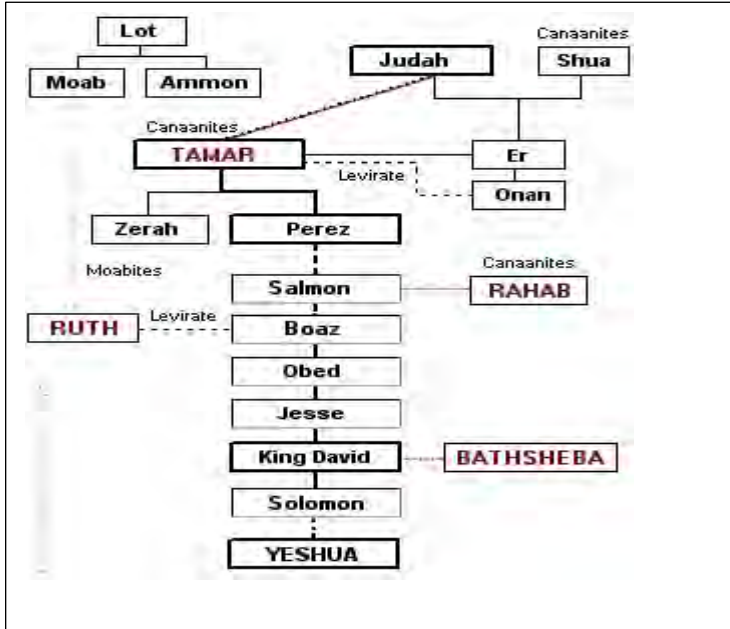
(4) Solomon's officials, prosperity, and wisdom

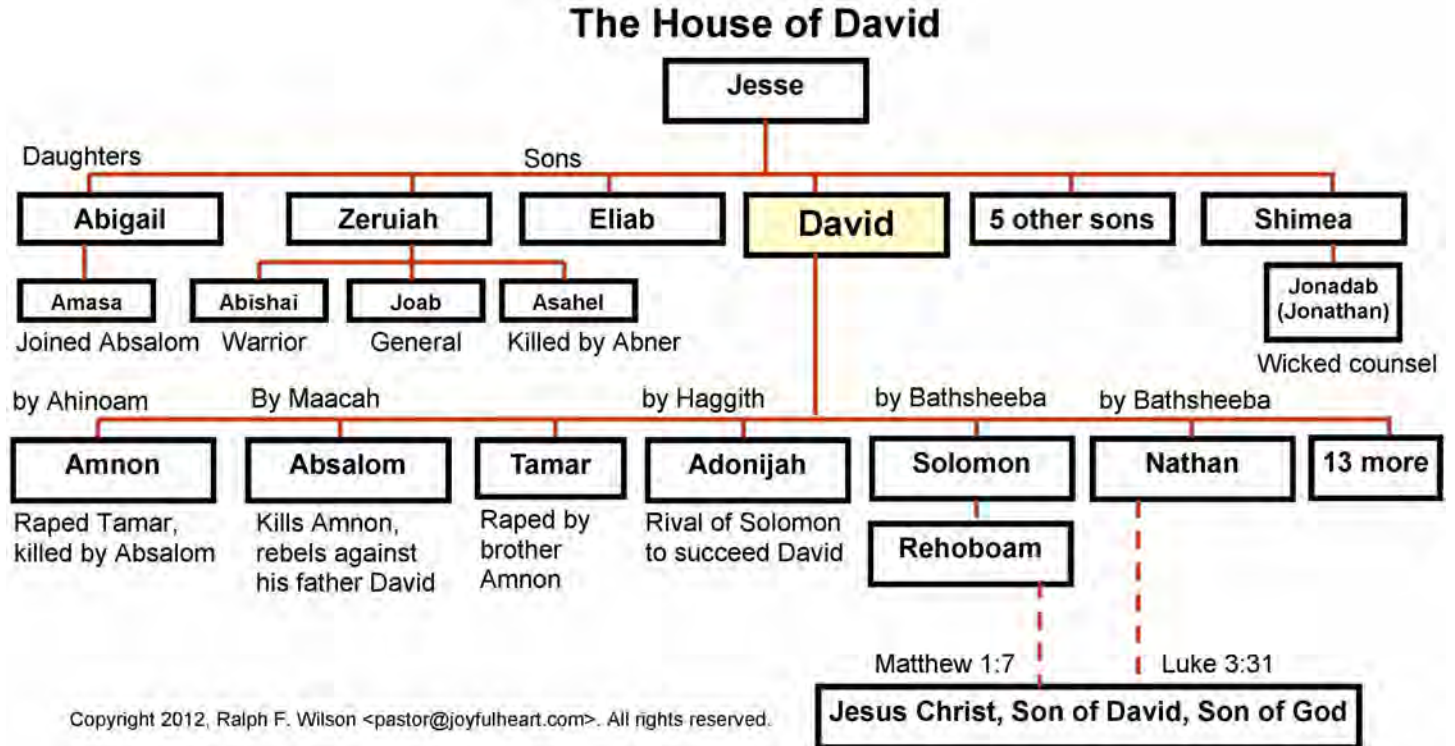
David's Travels as a Fugitive



David's Ancestors

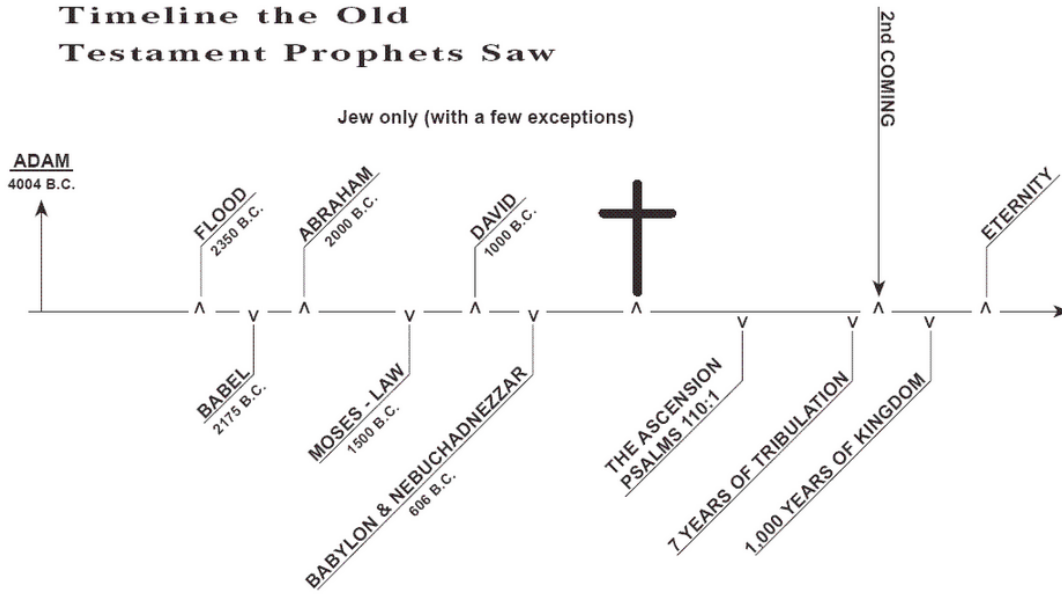

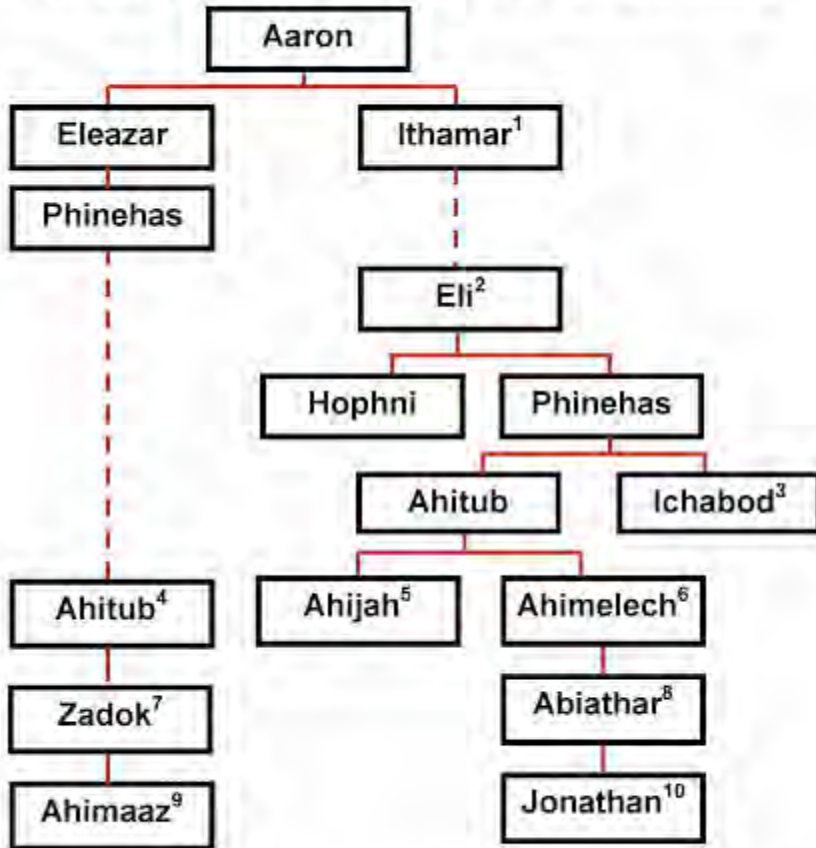

Timeline the Old Testament Prophets Saw

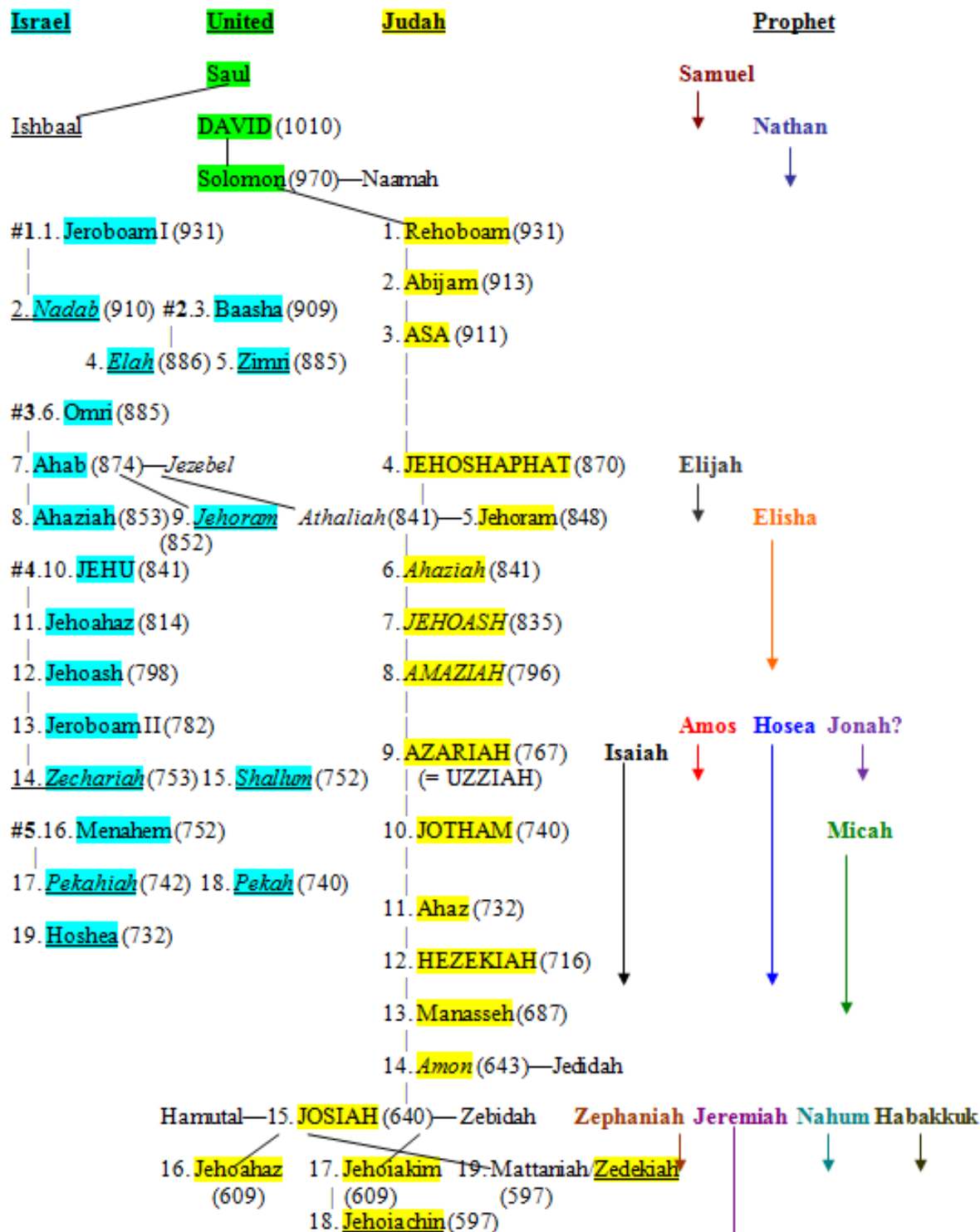


Line of the Priest
