Looking Back 7:20-7:40

Summary of this week's reading ...

Solomon completes David's desire of a beautiful Temple. He has a wonderful future but disobedience and sin derails him and the nation is torn in two. God sends His prophets but again, for the most part the kings go their own ways, moving away from God's precepts, and live like the people they had removed from the land.

Daily and Chapter Summaries

1 Kings 5-8

The Temple Built and Dedicated

(5) Hiram of Tyre provides wood for the temple, Hiram praises Solomon, Solomon's labor force

(6) the temple construction begins 480 years after leaving Egypt, its description, and completed in seven years

(7) Solomon's palace description taking 13 years to complete, Hiram a craftman from Tyre works on the furnishings and ornamentation of the tabernacle, round basin, and water carts, inventory

(8) movement of the ark into the temple, the sacrifices, the cloud, the dedication, and the occasions for praying toward the temple, 14 day celebration and final blessing

Saturday: April 3

1 Kings 9-11

The Success and Failure of Solomon

(9) the Lord appeared to Solomon a second time, 20 years to build the temple, Hiram's gifts, "Cabal", buildings, conscripted labor, fleet of ships

(10) visit by Queen of Sheba, 500 shields, throne, wealth, sailing ships, gifts, chariots and horses, gold and silver

(11) many wives, foreign God's, turning away from the Lord, Solomon's adversaries (Hadad, Rezon, and Jeroboam), Ahijah's prophecy to Jeroboam and Solomon's death

Sunday: April 4...Happy Easter "He Has Risen"

1 Kings 12-16

Israel is Divided

(12) Rehoboam (*Judah, 22 years, 1/19, evil*) becomes king, speak harshly to the people, Jeroboam (*Israel, 17 years 1/19, evil*) rebels (message from the prophet [Shemaiah](#)) and Jeroboam builds up Bethel and Dan placing too gold calves + unauthorized priest and festivals

(13) the message from the "man of God", disobedience, and death, Jeroboam would not repent

(14) Abijah's (Jeroboam's son) illness, Ahijah's answer, prophecy against Israel, King Sheshak of Egypt steals gold shields, Jeroboam's death and Rehoboam's reign

(15) Abijam (*Judah 3 years, 2/19*), Asa (*Judah 41 years, 3/19*), treaty with Ben-hadad, Nadab (*Israel 2 years, 2/20*), multiples wars between Judah and Israel, killing of Jeroboam's descendants

(16) Baasha (*Israel 24 years, 3/19*), Jehu the prophet, Elah (*Israel 2 years, 4/19*), Zimri (*Israel 7 days, 5/19*), Omri (*Israel, 12 years, 6/19*), and Ahab (*Israel, 22 years, 7/19*) marries Jezebel and worships Baal, the curse of Jericho

Monday: April 5th

1 Kings 17-19

Elijah's triumph and opposition

(17) Elijah predicts no rain, ravens feed and the widow of Zarephath and resuscitates son

(18) the servant of the Lord, Obadiah, in Ahab's palace, the contest of the Elijah and the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel, and rain

(19) Jezebel's threat, visit by the Angel of the Lord, and travel to Mt. Sinai and God encourages Elijah, anoints Elisha

Tuesday: April 6th

1 Kings 20-22

Wicked Ahab

(20) Ben-hadad of Aram threatens Ahab, a certain prophet (a man of God) predicts success but Ahab condemns for not killing Ben-hadad, one of the group of the prophets

21) Naboth's property, Jezebel arranges Naboth's death, Elijah predicts destruction of Ahab's family, Ahab repentance

(22) Ahab and Jehoshaphat (Judah 25 years, 4/19) joins in battle against the king of Aram, Michiah's prophecy, Ahab's death and Ahaziah (Israel, 2 years, 8/19) becomes the next king, Jehoshaphat's reign and failures

2 Kings 1-3

Elijah's authority passes to Elisha

(1) Ahaziah pursues Elijah and Elijah prophecies against Ahaziah,

(2) Elijah passes leadership to Elisha, Elijah's whirlwind, and Elisha demonstrates his authority

(3) Joram (Israel, 12 years, 9/19) becomes king, Elisha consulted and predicts the defeat of Moab, the Moabites offend the Israelites by offering a human sacrifice

Reasons for God to hear from heaven after praying toward this temple...if defeated by the enemy, if it does not rain, if there is famine, plague, or insects, if a foreigner prays, if fighting enemies, if sin against God, it taken into exile then hear from heaven

Pharaoh's daughter vv. 3:1, 7:8, 9:24, 11:1-3

Turning the Hearts of Kings & Men:

1 Kings 11:9⁹ Now the Lord was angry with Solomon because his heart was turned away from the Lord, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice,

Psalm 16:4 The sorrows of those who have bartered for another god will be multiplied;

The turning of hearts away from God and to other gods is the evil which all subsequent kings of Israel were measured: 1 Kings 13:34; 15:30; 16:2-3, 19,

Turning back God's judgement is a humbled heart:

2 Chronicles 12: 5 ... 6 So the princes of Israel and the king humbled themselves and said, "The Lord is righteous." 7 When the Lord saw that they humbled themselves, the word of the Lord came to Shemaiah, saying, "They have humbled themselves so I will not destroy them, but I will grant them some measure of deliverance, and My wrath shall not be poured out on Jerusalem by means of Shishak. 8 But they will become his slaves so that they may learn the difference between My service and the service of the kingdoms of the countries."

1 Kings 21:27 28 29 27 It came about when Ahab heard these words, that he tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and fasted, and he lay in sackcloth and went about despondently.

"Do you see how Ahab has humbled himself before Me? Because he has humbled himself before Me, I will not bring the evil in his days, but I will bring the evil upon his house in his son's days."

Humbling ourselves before God is nothing more seeing Who's we really are.

Surely you should celebrate the pleasures and comforts that God puts in your life, but if you love them, you soon be addicted. We cannot get to the place where we love the gift & not the Giver. Your heart will never be satisfied but, if you love the Giver your heart will be content and you will be able to enjoy his blessings while keeping them in proper place.

Beneath this reality are even deeper spiritual realities..

- The first is that you need to understand that you were created for love. You don't just love , you are a lover. Every human beings life is a quest to find something to love and a quest to be loved. This means that you are always surrendering your affections of your heart to something. Whatever commands the love of your heart also shapes the direction of your life.
- You were also created to worship. You don't just occasionally worship in moments of intentional and formal activity; you are a worshiper. You are always looking for something to which you can attach your identity, your hopes and dreams, and your inner peace. Whatever controls the worship of your heart controls your words, choices, emotions, & actions.

Now because you are a sinner, it is very tempting to give the love & worship that you were meant to give to God and God alone to something in the creation.

Rom.1:22-25 ²¹ For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened. ²² Professing to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for an image

You take the affection, submission, and service of your heart that was meant to be reserved for your Creator and you place it on some created thing. We all do this at some time or another.

So the desire for good possessions isn't wrong, but it must not rule your heart.

The hunger for comfort and ease is not ungodly in itself, but it must not rule your heart. The desire for love of another person is not wrong, but again it must not rule your heart.

A desire for even a good thing becomes a bad thing when that desire becomes a ruling thing.

So what does Grace do?? Grace works to rescue you from you by progressively breaking your bondage to the created world and turning to the deeper affection of your heart toward God.

God alone is worthy of your worship. God alone is able to satisfy and bring peace to your heart. This work of rescue is not yet complete in any of us. Yes, *by grace we love the world less than we once did and we surely love God more than before*, but our hearts are still torn and our loyalties at points are still confused. But we need not fret because grace will win and bring final rest to our worship & our love.

1 John 2:1-7 My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; ² and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world³ By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments. ⁴ The one who says, "I have come to know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him;⁵ but whoever keeps His word, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are in Him: ⁶ the one who says he abides in Him ought himself to walk in the same manner as He walked.

15 Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. 17 The world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God lives forever.

What are those Graces God gives to keep my heart humbled and devoted primarily to Him??





Genealogy of the Priests in David's Time




Kings and Prophets of Israel and Judah (modified 3/4/2011)










David's Wives and Sons
